Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Though both the Schools the trustees have been supporting - the San Remegio Central School and the Don Calixto Sr Yongco Elementary School – remained closed during this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the schools have continued modular or remote learning throughout the last academic year.

The trustees have continued to provide the funding for bags of food essentials that has enabled the feeding once a week of 150 children, who have been identified by a government programme as being undernourished, at Don Calixto Sr Yongco Elementary School. The bag is handed out to parents when they collect the learning modules at the School.

The trustees also provided funds to the San Remegio Central School to enable them to purchase a photocopier, toners and 300 reams of bond paper that has allowed them to produce the learning materials needed by their scholars.

The Foundation does not at present have a Reserves Policy. The funding of the feeding programme is not committed to by the trustees unless they are sure that sufficient funds are already held. For that reason, a Reserves Policy is considered to be unnecessary at this time.

At the end of the financial year, the Foundation held funds amounting to £6,359.72. This was £4,112.31 more than the funds held at the start of the year.

During the year, £4,090.50 was spent on the feeding programme and the food essentials. This was £3,017.50 less than in the previous year.

The Foundation's main source of income are the surpluses from organised fundraising and sponsorship events and donations. During the year:

- no fundraising events could be held because of the coronavirus pandemic;
- sponsorship events organised in their place raised £3,267.75; and
- donations received, including Gift Aid, were £4,973.71, up from £2,868.31 in the previous year.
